The PURPOSE of the Pace Center is to make service and civic engagement a central part of the Princeton student experience so that students can respond to the needs of the world in responsible ways.



## What to look for in a service project:

- Hands-on activity (it's possible, even now!)
- Community impact
- Bringing Tigers together
- Demonstrating Princeton's commitment to service (locally, not just globally)
- Sustainability
- Safety (what can be done remotely?)
